Palmer Street Asset Removal Works

What works are coming up?

Council is removing the parking meter footings and associated infrastructure along Palmer, Dibbs, Anthony, Tomlins and Plume Streets in Townsville City.

Please be advised that expanding paid parking across Townsville has been suspended. This decision was made during the Townsville City Council's Special Meeting on Wednesday 9 October 2024.

When will the works take place?

What will the works include?

- Remove the existing parking meter footings located within the pathway and replace the affected area of the pathway.
- Remove all markings and associated finishes related to the parking meters.
- Reinstate the pathway after the removal of the meter footings.

What does this mean for me?

If you live in or are travelling through the area, you may experience:

- construction machinery and vehicle movement
- increased levels of dust, noise, and vibrations
- temporary traffic changes, including on-street parking bay closures, minor traffic delays and reduced speed limits.

Roadworks: What you need to know

Did you know Townsville City Council maintains more than 1,842km of roads and more than 3,335km of associated kerb and channel throughout our region?

Maintaining our Council-controlled road network ensures the community's transportation needs are adequately met and continues to support the growth of our region.

You may experience:

use of construction machinery and vehicle movement



increased levels of dust, noise, and vibrations



temporary traffic changes, including lane closures, minor traffic delays and reduced speed limits.



Traffic Changes

During construction activities, there may be temporary changes to the traffic flow. Traffic controllers and signs will be in place to guide local traffic. Expect traffic delays and temporary loss of car parking spaces. Council advises residents and visitors to allow extra travel time.

Access to Property

You will have access to your property with minimal disruptions. If temporary access restrictions are necessary, Council will contact you at least 24 hours prior.

Arranging Access

You can arrange access to your property by speaking to an on-site crew leader or by calling Council on **13 48 10** for arrangements.

Parking

Please ensure that your vehicles are always parked within your property or on a nearby street before 6am on the day of construction and off the road during the works.

Irrigation System

Inform an on-site crew leader if there is an irrigation system on the nature strip before work begins. After completing the work, check the system's operation and report any damage within one month.
