






Your yellow-lidded bin is for recycling household packaging items:

Our waste team works every single day of the year, so please remember to:

- 🕑 Place your bins at the kerb by 6am.
- Sensure there is half a metre between your bins.
- Ensure no cars, trees or letterboxes are blocking access to your bins.
- Make sure your bin is not overloaded (max weight 50kg), and your bin lid can close shut.



Contamination makes recycling more expensive and damages our recycling facility.

The below items should never be placed in your recycling bin and always go in your red-lidded general waste bin.

Can't make it to the transfer station?

Each **residential property** is entitled to **1 free kerbside** hard waste collection per financial year.

Up to 2 cubic metres of household hard waste including whitegoods, furniture and timber products can be collected.

Additional kerbside collections can be arranged for a fee.


Minimise food waste with SAVEFUL

Containers for Change

Did you know Townsville households send more than \$1.5 million worth of 10c containers to landfill each year?

Remember, you can collect your eligible juice poppers, cans, beer, wine and spirit bottles, and drop them to your nearest Containers for Change refund point or place them in your household recycling bin.

Not only does this help reduce landfill waste, but it also rewards you with extra cash, making it a win-win for both the environment and your wallet.

Supersize your recycling

Recycling bin overflowing? Want to recycle more?

Townsville City Council are offering residents an extra 120L of recycling space per fortnight for a one-off fee. Upgrade from a 240L recycling bin to a 360L recycling bin to supersize your recycling efforts!

Don't bin it, B-cycle it!

Batteries are the most common form of hazardous household waste in Australia. Batteries in bins cause more than 10,000 fires each year in collection trucks and at waste facilities across the country.

When safely recycled through the B-cycle scheme, up to 95% of a battery's components can be turned into new batteries or used in other industries.

Where can I drop off my batteries in Townsville?

You can drop off any of your household batteries for free in the Eco Batt collection vessels at the following Council locations:

- Stuart Waste Transfer Station
 24 Vantassel Street, Stuart
- Hervey Range Resource Recovery Centre
 811 Hervey Range Road, Alice River
- Magnetic Island Waste Transfer Station 65-73 West Point Road, Picnic Bay

For battery drop-off points closer to you, check **Recycle Mate.**
